### Payment options

Each semester, students have the option of paying in full or signing up for a payment plan.

\* **Payment in Full:** If you choose to pay in full, you must pay the Total Amount Due by the current semester's due date of the first installment.

\* **Payment Plan:** You can sign up for the Payment Plan through the Student Account section of your portal or through the Authorized User portal. To sign up, login to [My.IllinoisState.edu](http://My.IllinoisState.edu), choose the *Student tab*, under *Finances* click on *Student Accounts*, then choose *Fall 2015 Activity and beyond*. Or click on the Authorized User link on the Student Accounts' home page. If you sign up for the payment plan, you will be charged a \$35 installment fee for fall and spring semesters and \$30 for summer semester.

### Payment methods

• **Electronic Check** – [Students](#) and [Authorized Users](#) can make payments electronically through their portal.

\* **Credit Cards** – [Students](#) and [Authorized Users](#) can make credit card payments electronically through their portal. Most credit cards are accepted and there is a convenience fee that will be charged.

• **By Mail** – You can mail us a check or a money order. This may take a few business days to be received and processed.

\* **In Person** – You can go to the [Student Accounts Building](#) to make a payment. We accept cash, checks, money orders and debit card payments (pin required).

• **Drop Box** – A drop box is located outside of the Student Accounts Building. You can place your payment in the drop box and it will be processed the next business day.

\* **International Students** can pay their account through *Flywire* by PeerTransfer at this link: [www.flywire.com/pay/ilstu](http://www.flywire.com/pay/ilstu)

### Authorized Users

Set up parents or other users to allow online access to view account activity, make payments, setup payment plan and other features.

### Address changes

It is the student's responsibility to be sure all their addresses on file are correct and up-to-date. Students can update their addresses through their Student Service Center portal.

### eRefunds (Direct deposit of refunds)

We encourage all students to sign up for *eRefunds* through their [my.illinoisstate.edu](http://my.illinoisstate.edu) portal. Go to your Student Service Center and click on the Student Accounts Service Center link. At the top of the page is a link for *eRefunds*.

Once you have signed up, it will take 14 days for the account to be active. Therefore, if a refund is generated before the 14 days are up, a paper check will be generated. Be sure your address are correct in the system.

*Note:* Parent PLUS loans will not direct deposit, unless the PLUS application is marked to release the excess funds to the student.

### Mailing

#### STATEMENTS

Monthly statements are mailed to the student at their Billing Address that is on file with the University. If no Billing address is in the system, it will look for a Mailing Address or Home Address. To change where your statements are mailed, be sure to update the Billing Address through your Student Service Center.

#### REFUNDS

Refunds, for students who fail to sign up for direct deposit, are mailed to the campus or mailing address during the fall and spring semesters and to the mailing or home address during the summer and over breaks. Failure to update your address will delay any refund check getting to you.

### Financial aid disbursement

Completed Financial aid will be applied to your current-year charges and remaining funds will be directly deposited or mailed to you.

All loan borrowers (Federal loans or Perkins loans) be sure to Accept and complete all paperwork needed so loans can apply to your account.

Check your *To Do List* on the Student Service Center to see if there is anything you still need to complete and submit to the Financial Aid Office.

Refund distribution will begin on the Friday prior to the first day of classes and continue every Friday as aid is processed.

# Student charges

## **TUITION**

Undergraduate tuition is determined by using the tables found on pages 8—11. Graduate tuition is on page 26.

## **GENERAL FEES**

General Fees are assessed at a per credit hour rate. A detailed listing of these fees is included in the student's specific tuition/general fees rate table on pages 12- 26.

## **OUTREACH FEES**

Depending on your tuition rate table, some students that are taking classes off site, via the Internet or special programs may be assessed Outreach Fees per credit hour **instead** of general fees. See individual tuition table for rates.

*Students assessed outreach fees **only** are not charged for student insurance.*

## **STUDENT INSURANCE**

An insurance fee is automatically assessed to all students who register for 9 or more credit hours during the fall and spring semesters or 6 or more credit hours during the summer semester. The insurance fee is included in the general fees charge on the billing statement. Students assessed *outreach fees only* are **not** charged for student insurance.

Coverage is worldwide, with a \$50 deductible (waived when coordinating with another plan) and a \$1 million maximum. Please contact Student Insurance for further information and options at (309) 438-2515 or visit the [Student Health Insurance Web site](#).

It is strongly recommended that you remain enrolled in this plan because it can help close the gaps left by other coverage. Sometimes a family plan has restrictions which limit a student's access to care. The benefits offered by Illinois State University are payable anywhere in the world and are designed to provide excellent coverage alone or in combination with other coverage.

## **Insurance reduction**

Students who are assessed the student insurance fee can apply to waive this insurance under the following circumstances:

- Student must demonstrate equal or better coverage **and**
- complete a written application at the Student Insurance Office, 230 Student Services Building.

*The waiver **MUST** be completed **each semester**. Please see the fall, spring or summer section for deadlines to waive the insurance. No waiver requests will be accepted after the deadline.*

## **MATERIAL FEE CHARGES**

Material Fee charges are assessed when registering for certain courses that will be using materials provided by the University. Courses having a material fee charge or fee in the prerequisite and comments column will be assessed on the billing statement. This fee varies in amount depending on class and materials. Material fees are optional to the student, since he or she must be allowed the opportunity to purchase the needed material from other sources. In these cases an authorization form must be completed and sent to the Student Account's office. [A copy of the form is available on our website](#).

## **LATE FEES**

Late fees are assessed each month when payment is not received by the billing due date. **Not receiving a bill does not release you from late penalties.** Please check your myillinoisstate portal or contact our office if you do not receive a bill by the end of the month. The following late fees will be assessed to your next statement.

## **IMMUNIZATION COMPLIANCE FEE**

## **OTHER CHARGES**

Other departments on campus also utilize the billing system to assess charges to students. These may include Health Services, Pharmacy, Parking, Redbird Card Office, Athletics, International Studies and others. *NOTE: Illinois State University Student Health Services does not file claims for charges assessed for use of health services or pharmacy areas. You are responsible for filing any claims with your insurance company.*

## **STUDENT-TO-STUDENT GRANT**

This refundable fee, assessed during the fall and spring semesters, provides support for needy and disadvantaged students. Refund application must be completed in the Student Accounts Office by the 15th day of class for each semester.

## **AUDIT HOURS**

Students auditing a class(es) will be charged all applicable tuition and fees based on your tuition table rate.

## **Return check/E-check policy**

**Special warning about payments:** A penalty of \$25.00 is assessed for each check/E-check returned to the University. Check cashing privileges will be suspended when more than one check/E-check is returned to the University. In most cases, the person who endorses a two-party check is the one liable for any penalties charged if that check is returned. Any check / E-check(s) returned originally issued to clear a delinquency thereby permitting the student to register will result in cancelled classes if he or she fails to pay in full his or her returned check/E-check(s), check fee(s) and balance due. Please contact the Student Accounts Office with questions.

#### WITHDRAWAL FROM THE UNIVERSITY

The withdrawal policy for all students is based on the date of withdrawal. Tuition, general fees and outreach fees will be charged according to the table below. Withdrawals through September 6, 2016, will result in a reduction of the student insurance fee and cancellation of coverage as of the beginning of the semester. Withdrawals after September 6, 2016, will not result in a reduction of the student insurance fee and coverage will be in force for the remainder of the semester (see [Student Insurance Office](#) for more details).

### Student insurance

For an insurance waiver, the student must demonstrate equal coverage and complete a written application at the [Student Insurance Office](#) in the Student Services Building on or before May 22, 2017.

### Withdrawal from a course or the University

A student who registers and officially withdraws from the University or from a course may receive a reduction of tuition and general fees according to the following schedule.

**Note:** Insurance is refundable only if the withdrawal occurs on or before May 22, 2017.

**Withdraw date:** Prior to the first scheduled meeting time  
**Reduction:** 100% of tuition and general fees except insurance

**Withdraw date:** Up to and including the last day to withdraw without receiving a grade  
**Reduction:** 100% tuition and general fees except insurance

**Withdraw date:** After the last day to withdraw without receiving a grade  
**Reduction:** None

# Undergraduate tuition/general fees freeze rate and duration table

Undergraduate tuition (in-state/out-of-state) and general fees shall freeze based on the following tables. The duration of the initial freeze rate depends on the qualified primary major/sequence carried within the individual’s catalog year as of the last day of the last undergraduate semester attended within the four continuous calendar years after being classified as first enrolled<sup>1</sup>.

If during a future semester, a student becomes classified as a graduate, the prevailing graduate rates and general fees shall apply<sup>2</sup>.

The undergraduate majors/sequences on pages 6 - 8 qualify for five- and six-year freeze rates and terms.

**Please note:** insurance, installment, etc., are not considered frozen fees.

**Upon the expiration of the initial and additional two-year freeze periods, the prevailing rates shall apply.**
